I am thrilled to say welcome back to the 2019-2020 school year! As the new Santa Clara Unified School District superintendent, I'm extremely honored to serve in partnership with you as we continue to cultivate a world-class educational program for the children of our community. As I onboard in the district, I have been and plan to be out and about visiting you to learn about your contribution to the district and hear your ideas.

Our staff's work this past year brought progress on many fronts. Now, with the start of the 2019-2020 school year, we have new opportunities and challenges to improve the lives and futures of Santa Clara Unified's children. Your support is integral to ensuring that our schools are highly effective centers of learning. Shortly we will be launching a renewal of the district's strategic plan, along with the development of a Portrait of the Graduate, which will provide strategic direction for the overall educational experience for our graduates. As we transition into the 2019-2020 school year, several important priorities for us include:

School safety and attendance: Safety is our very top priority. To ensure safe campuses, we are launching districtwide evaluation of our safety preparation and response program. School and department teams will receive training as we develop this system and there will be a districtwide exercise to test our emergency response protocols later this school year. This is in addition to our ongoing safety drills at schools. We wish that these safety preparations and exercises were not necessary, but this is our reality. Additionally, we are focusing on strategies to address chronic absenteeism. To be successful in our mission to prepare all students for success, we need our students to be in school with us every day.

Quality instruction and timely supports: We are steadily improving student achievement by supporting highly skilled teachers teaching the core content standards while enriching our schools with music, STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics) education, elementary physical education, world languages, and dual enrollment programs at the high schools. To continue to provide choice for our families, we will open a Spanish dual immersion program at Scott Lane Elementary School, a strong K-8 program at Don Callejon, and innovative programming at our new elementary and middle schools on the Agnews campus. We will continue to offer classroom and school-based intervention strategies and support services for all students who need them. Additionally, we have worked to bring in foundation funds for enrichment programs, raising over half a million dollars in the last two years from generous contributors including the Santa Clara Schools Foundation, Intel, Roche, GLOBALFOUNDRIES, Santa Clara Rotary, Santa Clara Firefighters Foundation, Silicon Valley Power, and the City of Santa Clara.

Timely and effective communication systems: Communicating effectively and providing quality service to our schools, families, and community benefits all of our children. We are developing standards for responding to concerns, formalizing and communicating processes, and providing quick access to information through traditional and modern communication tools.

This issue of the Annual Review focuses on our construction updates. We value communication, transparency, and fiscal responsibility and we hope you enjoy this special construction edition so you can see that your dollars are well spent. Since 2010, voters have passed over \$1 billion in funding to upgrade and construct new facilities. Santa Clara Unified School District has a Board of Trustees and a community that has repeatedly supported our students' learning by approving general obligation bonds. Upgraded, high-quality instructional facilities — through the financial support of our voters — allow us to better accomplish our mission to prepare each student for success in our ever-changing world. We are committed to our mission, and so is our school board and community. Later this fall, after our state assessment results come in, we will publish another issue of the Annual Review focused on our academic programs, achievements, and challenges. At the end of the school year, after extensive community engagement and planning, we will share with you our "Portrait of a Graduate" and new strategic plan.

This will be a busy year for us, and I look forward to meeting you as I get to know the district and our community. Santa Clara Unified is a wonderful place to be and I appreciate your ongoing pride of our district, students, and staff.


completed at seven elementary schools. You will continue to see playground construction projects completed during our summer breaks over the next few years.

Bond funds will build five new schools in the next few years at Agnews, Patrick Henry/Laurelwood, and New Valley High School to address enrollment growth in our district. New shade structure installation has begun at our schools and will continue in phases over the next three years. Other Measure BB fund projects include new artificial turf fields at the high schools, energy efficiency upgrades and new classroom buildings across the district, a new pool and locker room at Peterson Middle School, and major renovations at Bracher, Briarwood, and Westwood elementary schools.

School safety is another important priority in our facilities program. We completed upgrades to our surveillance system last year and are improving perimeter security from Measure BB funds. We are completing a comprehensive security review of our campuses and will be installing new

fencing around our schools. Santa Clara Unified schools were built in a different era. We are moving toward better access control on

our campuses and there may be inconvenience to staff, students, and the community. We can all agree, though, that the safety of our schools takes precedence.





## **Naming Our Schools**

In preparation for opening the elementary and middle schools, this fall we begin the process to name all three schools on the Agnews campus. The Board of Trustees will select a name for each school after seeking input from the community. That is where you come in!


# FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### **How Did We Do?**

Santa Clara Unified ended the 2018-2019 school year with another balanced budget.

As a community-funded school district, we must use our local resources to provide for all our educational programs throughout the district with very little assistance from the state and federal government.

It takes people to provide a quality public education, and most of the district's expenditures are committed to employee salaries and benefits. The district was able to increase salaries last year to attract and retain highly qualified teachers and staff while maintaining a balanced budget. The district was also able to complete its 1:1 Chromebook initiative, expand programs addressing student wellness, advance Title IX equity in athletics, and enhance student safety.



The majority of the district's funding comes from local property taxes rather than state funding which is tied to average student daily attendance rates. As such, the district must thoughtfully plan each school year to cover all of our expenditures with only preliminary projections on tax revenue that do not become certain until taxes are paid. Community-funded districts, like Santa Clara Unified, tend to carry higher than average reserve funds to guard against enrollment growth, to maintain positive cash flow between tax installments, and to manage unforeseen fluctuations in property tax revenue during recessions or as discussed below. These together allow us to maintain a balanced budget each school year.

An example of the risks community-funded districts face struck the district last fall. The refund of over \$13 million to the San Francisco 49ers in the 2018-2019 school year and the ongoing loss of over \$2 million per year due to the reassessment of the property tax for Levi's Stadium in the team's favor was a major setback. The district applauds the efforts of the County Assessor to challenge this wrongful decision to restore these public funds for the education of our students.

We welcome partnerships from our business community to fill the gap left by this loss.
